- 1. **LECTURE:** A course in which a teacher discourses on a specific topic to an audience of 10 to 500 or more students.
- 2. SCIENCE LAB: A course in which there is a supervised environment for groups of 10 to 30 students where the students can learn experimental techniques, develop skills, and, by means of appropriate experiments, reinforce theoretical concepts which have been presented in lecture classes.
- **3. STUDIO ART:** An art course in which there is a supervised environment for groups of 10 to 20 students where the students can develop manual and artistic skills.
- **4. PRACTICUM:** A course which is devoted to observation and assisting the regular teacher; while devoting a small portion of time to some practice teaching.
- **5. INTERNSHIP:** A course in which the agency provides the environment and general supervision of the student in a specialized technical area. The faculty member serves as an educational consultant, and reviews with the students, on an ongoing basis, the relation of the field experiences to the context of the educational programs's objectives.
- **6. CLINIC EXPERIENCE:** A course in which the faculty member (generally in an off-campus facility under the control of an external agency) supervises, coordinates, and instructs the students in the development of special skills and professional relationships.
- **7. THEATRE ART:** A theatre course in which there is a supervised environment for groups of 1 0 to 20 students where the students, can develop manual and artistic skills.
- **8. INDIVIDUAL MUSIC:** A course in which **a** one to one relation exits between student and teacher in direct instruction for developing student skills with voice or a particular instrument.
- **9. GROUP MUSIC:** A course in which a group relationship exists between students and teacher in direct instruction for developing student skills with voice or a particular instrument..
- 10. **FIELD WORK:** A course in which the agency provides the supervision and direct instruction of the student. The faculty member serves in **a** consultant and coordinating role in working with the agency, but has virtually no contact with the student.
- 11. MAJOR PHYSICAL ED: A course which is a required course for the training of physical education teachers.
- 12. NON MAJOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION: A course which is an elective recreational activity class that is open to the entire student population rather than physical education majors.
- **13. PRACTICE TEACHING:** A course in which an education major spends one full quarter in teaching at an operational elementary or secondary school.
- **14. INDEPENDENT STUDY:** A project which can be done on **a** one to one basis or **a** group basis. The project may include readings, individual projects or group projects.
- 15. HONORS: An enriched course where both faculty and students participate in more hours than an non-honor course.
