#### MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 11, 2004 BOARD MEETINGS:

The minutes of the December 11, 2004 Board meetings were approved as distributed.

#### **SWEARING IN OF NEW TRUSTEE:**

Newly appointed trustee, Kenneth Campbell was introduced and sworn into office by Ms. Temple. Mr. Campbell was welcomed with a round of applause.

#### CHAIR'S REPORT:

Mr. Taylor reported that on January 7, 2005 The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) approved the accreditation of the Cotsakos College of Business with special commendation citing the strengths of the Russ Berrie Institute for Professional Sales, the E\*Trade Learning Center and the College's faculty. Dean Boronico thanked the William Paterson University community for their support in achieving this prestigious accreditation.

Mr. Taylor reported that the Board is currently involved in a self-assessment process and a comprehensive assessment of the President, in compliance with the Board policy that mandates this be done every five years. He said that two important functions of the Board are to select the President and to provide on-going assessment aimed at improvement. The evaluation underway will help accomplish both. The Board has selected two consultants through the Association of Governing Boards (AGB). They will be conducting confidential interviews on March 21, 22, 23 and 24 with a variety of university constituencies. They will report their aggregate findings to the Board. The Board will report on the findings at the May 7 Board meeting.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. Dr. Speert welcomed individually those faculty members who were tenured as a result of reappointments approved by the Board at the December 11, 2004 meeting. The newly tenured faculty were invited to the Board meeting and luncheon to today to meet the Board and to recognize their achievements.
- 2. The President spoke about the Governor's FY2006 Budget message. He reported that it was more positive than the last few years. The Governor recognized that the public colleges and universities were particularly hard hit in the past few years. However, there are no capital funds identified for higher education and the salary program continues to be under-funded. There will be state-wide public hearings on the budget with an opportunity to voice concerns on these and other issues. Students from the state colleges and universities have joined together to develop ways to lobby for increased support. Student trustees are spearheading this initiative.
- 3. Dr. Speert introduced Kate Muldoon, Director of the Small Business Development Center. The Center is a joint venture between the University, the Urban Enterprise Zone of the City of Paterson, and the New Jersey Small Business Association. And is located in downtown Paterson. Ms. Muldoon gave a presentation on the development, activities and achievements of the Center over the past year. The Trustees commended Ms. Muldoon for her leadership and accomplishments as the Director of the Center and recognized the vital role the Center provides for the students and the community.

The Committee also heard a presentation on the Student Leadership Institute, updates on the activities of Counseling, Health and Wellness Center, updates on new residence halls and the development of learning communities there. The Provost spoke about an academic "College Bowl" to be held on March 8, 9, and 10 with the winning team advancing to a regional competition.
